



### High Efficiency, 1.2MHz, 3A Synchronous Step Down Regulator


### **General Description**

The SY8893L is a high efficiency 1.2MHz synchronous step down DC/DC regulator, which is capable of delivering up to 3A output currents. It can operate over a wide input voltage range from 2.5V to 5.5V and integrate main switch and synchronous switch with very low  $R_{DS}$  (ON) to minimize the conduction loss.

The SY8893L integrates the reliable latch-off function when output over voltage, output under voltage or thermal shutdown happens.


The SY8893L is in a space saving, low profile SOT563 package.





Figure2. Efficiency vs. Output Current

### **Block Diagram**




Figure3. Block Diagram

Time (800µs/div)








### Operation

The SY8893L is a high efficiency 1.2MHz synchronous step down DC/DC regulator, which is capable of delivering up to 3A output currents. It can operate over a wide input voltage range from 2.5V to 5.5V and integrate main switch and synchronous switch with very low  $R_{DS}$  (ON) to minimize the conduction loss.

The SY8893L integrates the reliable latch-off function when output over voltage, output under voltage or thermal shutdown happens.

The SY8893L is in a space saving, low profile SOT563 package.

#### **Short Circuit Protection**

After the soft-start is over, if the output voltage falls below 50% of the regulation level, the IC will turn off both power switches, then will enter short circuit protection. It will remain in this state until the IN or EN voltage is recycled.

#### **Over Voltage Protection**

If the output voltage exceeds 120% of the regulation level, the IC will turn off both power switches and turn on the discharge switch, then will enter over voltage protection. It will remain in this state until the IN or EN voltage is recycled.

#### **Thermal Shutdown Protection**

If the junction temperature of the SY8893L is greater than the thermal shutdown temperature ( $T_{SD}$ ), the IC will turn off both power switches, and then will enter thermal shutdown protection. It will remain in this state until the IN or EN voltage is recycled.

### **Applications Information**

Because of the high integration in the SY8893L, the application circuit based on this regulator is rather simple. Only the input capacitor  $C_{IN}$ , the output capacitor  $C_{OUT}$ , the output inductor L and the feedback resistors ( $R_H$  and  $R_L$ ) need to be selected for the targeted application specifications.

#### Feedback Resistor Dividers R<sub>H</sub> and R<sub>L</sub>

Choose  $R_H$  and  $R_L$  to program the proper output voltage. To minimize the power consumption under light loads, it is desirable to choose large resistance values for both  $R_H$  and  $R_L$ . A value of between  $1k\Omega$ and  $1M\Omega$  is highly recommended for both resistors. If  $R_L = 120k\Omega$  is chosen, then  $R_H$  can be calculated to be:

$$R_{\rm H} = \frac{(V_{\rm OUT} - 0.6 \, \rm V) \times R_{\rm L}}{0.6 \, \rm V}$$

#### Input Capacitor CIN

A typical X5R or better grade ceramic capacitor with 10V rating and greater than  $10\mu$ F capacitance is recommended. To minimize the potential noise problem, this ceramic capacitor should be placed really close to the IN and GND pins. Care should be taken to minimize the loop area formed by C<sub>IN</sub>, and IN/GND pins.

#### **Output Inductor L**

There are several considerations in choosing this inductor.

 Choose the inductance to provide the desired ripple current. It is suggested to choose the ripple current to be about 40% of the maximum output current. The inductance is calculated as:

$$L = \frac{V_{\text{OUT}}(1 - V_{\text{OUT}}/V_{\text{IN,MAX}})}{f_{\text{SW}} \times I_{\text{OUT,MAX}} \times 40\%}$$

Where  $f_{SW}$  is the switching frequency and  $I_{OUT,MAX}$  is the maximum load current.

2) The saturation current rating of the inductor must be selected to be greater than the peak inductor current under full load conditions.

$$I_{\text{SAT, MIN}} > I_{\text{OUT, MAX}} + \frac{V_{\text{OUT}}(1\text{-}V_{\text{OUT}}/V_{\text{In, MAX}})}{2 \times f_{\text{SW}} \times L}$$

3) The DCR of the inductor and the core loss at the switching frequency must be low enough to achieve the desired efficiency requirement. It is desirable to choose an inductor with DCR<25m $\Omega$  to achieve a good overall efficiency.

#### **Load Transient Considerations**

The SY8893L integrates the compensation components to achieve good stability and fast transient responses. In some applications, adding a 22pF ceramic capacitor in parallel with  $R_H$  may further speed up the load transient responses and is thus recommended for applications with large load transient step requirements.

#### **OCP Protection Method**

With load current increasing, as soon as the high side FET current gets higher than peak current limit threshold, the high side FET will turn off. If the load



current continues to increase, the output voltage will drop. When the output voltage falls below 50% of the regulation level, the output UVP will be detected and the SY8893L will operate in latch off mode.

#### Layout Design

The layout design of the SY8893L is relatively simple. For the best efficiency and to minimize noise problems, the following components should be placed close to the IC:  $C_{IN}$ , L,  $R_{H}$  and  $R_{L}$ .

1) It is desirable to maximize the PCB copper area connecting to GND pin to achieve the best thermal and noise performance. If the board space allowed, a ground plane is highly desirable. Reasonable paths are suggested to be placed underneath the ground pad to enhance the soldering quality and thermal performance.

- 2)  $C_{IN}$  must be close to Pins IN and GND. The loop area formed by  $C_{IN}$  and GND must be minimized.
- 3) The PCB copper area associated with the LX pin must be minimized to avoid the potential noise problem.
- 4) The components  $R_H$  and  $R_L$ , and the trace connecting to the FB pin must NOT be adjacent to the LX net on the PCB layout to avoid the noise problem.






Figure 4. PCB Layout Suggestion

















1. Taping Orientation SOT563
